Mr. Nick continues to help teach phonics in class such as introducing the letter "C" (i.e. car, cake, carrot, crab). They're also enriching their vocabulary by learning parts of their body (i.e. head,





Ms. Thuy and Ms. Dong's Coconut Class (K1/K2) has been learning English with their social skills too, such as greeting people and saying goodbye. They have also been learning how to identify family members (i.e. "mother," "grandfather"). In Science, the students learned about various animals such as the life of a panda and of a giraffe. Mr. German and his guitar are always welcomed bv students. Recently, he taught them certain songs that helps them learn about action verbs.

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Ms. Quy's Year 1 class has been learning about their health such as the importance of brushing their teeth.
