#### Teachers Day

#### Exams

Their first exam will be oral English and is an individual speaking and reading task one-on-one with the teacher. This serves as a lasting memory of your travels as well good practice at writing for a purpose.

#### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

Our students have nearly finished their term two afterschool clubs. It has been wonderful to see the engagement of students in the various activities. Students in the Reuse and Recycle Club have been busy making piggy banks and developing a plan for recycling in classrooms; our Science Club students have been conducting exciting experiments and developing their Science vocabulary; Christmas Craft clubbers have been making festive decorations; and students in Target Club have been perfecting their aim and coordination.

The afterschool club information for term three will be coming out after the Christmas break. As we have a maximum number per group, please ensure your child brings their form back promptly to avoid missing out on an activity they would really like to be a part of. Clubs that do not meet their minimum number may be cancelled.

#### Water bottles
