# Craft Activities in Preparation for Mid-Autumn Festival

Prep Tiger Beetles have been busy with craft activities to prepare for the Mid-Autumn Festival Celebration. They showed great excitement painting different masks and pictures of Moon Festival. They also demonstrated their excellent fine motor skills and patience when drawing, cutting and pasting paper to make their lion puppets as well as decorating their lanterns for Lantern Parade. Through these activities, the children had a lot of fun when making their handmade products and were able to understand more about the traditions of Vietnam during this special celebration.



In the past, parents and grandparents often made paper masks for their children in preparation for the Mid-Autumn Festival. Paper masks are created in various interesting shapes such as animals and funny faces. The main material for these masks are a special type of paper made from cassava flour, boiled into glue, and left to dry. Our K2 students in Dragonfly Class really enjoyed this activity and were are all very excited to be wearing them for our celebrations at kindergarten and at home.



Mid-Autumn Festival is such an enjoyable time for our students as they prepare their beautiful lanterns and animal masks in readiness for our parade. The children in K1 Grasshopper Class also got to make Moon Cakes with Ms Do Linh. Making mooncakes



is simple and easy with three simple

step-by-step guides:

- 1. Mix the sticky rice flour with sugar water and stir very well.
- 2. Roll the dough into a ball and press the ball of dough flat.
- 3. Press the entire ball into the mooncake mold. The Moon Cake is done!





#### K1 Excursion to TiniWorld at Indochina Plaza

Lots of great learning has taken place around the theme of "My Toys". K1 students had an excursion to TiniWorld where they were able to investigate and play with lots of different kinds of toys and take physical part in many fun activities. They were excited to paint their own "Circles in a Circle" using colours to express their emotions while listening to classical music. What's more, their curiosity led them to take this type of art to the ICT room and they were astonished to discover that "Circles in a Circle" can also be done on a computer!
