Principal's Message: Sometimes, less is more.

Dear Parents.

About a month ago, I overheard someone giving a lengthy speech about the importance of kids doing their chores and respecting their parents. The discourse was not from a teacher to a classroom. It was from a parent at the school in response to his son's eye-rolling and huffing in public. There were times, as a parent and also as a grandparent, I did the same. Why? I thought talking to the child expansively meant instant results. No.

We tend to think we're parenting experts. Realistically, our self-perceived expertise never fully develops. As a parent, I thought I knew everything and I was mistaken. As a grandparent, I thought again that I knew more about parenting. Well, not exactly. It wasn't until my kids had kids and then I could watch outside the box. From that viewpoint, I saw that less is more.



We all know that parenting is tough because we love our children. Since highly effective teachers also bond with their students, they struggle with the same temptations. We want the best for them. We worry that they'll become irresponsible. We sometimes feel panicked because they don't seem to be turning out the way we hoped.

Lots of intense feelings can muddy our minds and leave us forgetting that we can't talk to children, young and semi-young, into being respectful, responsible and self-controlled. In fact, the more extensive our vocabularies become, the less effective we become. Some parents use authoritarian parenting strategies. This approach does not allow the child to have an independent voice or sense of efficacy. There are some parents who overcorrect with excessively lenient parenting. This doesn't teach kids about limits and self-control.

According to an article in Psychology Today, kids often tune out excessive talk by their parents. Research indicates that the human brain can keep only four "chunks" of information or unique ideas in short-term (active) memory at once. This amounts to about 30 seconds or one or two sentences of speaking.

The more words we use when things are going poorly, the less effective we become.

Many excellent and loving parents and educators are faltering. Not because they lack skills. No. It's because they talk too much while they're using their good skills.

Try this as an experiment: see what happens if you simply use fewer words when things are going poorly. The odds are high that you'll be glad you did.

I do not need to tell you that parenting is a difficult job. Moreover, it is a role in which we all make mistakes at times. Communicating effectually with our children takes time, patience, and drive. We need to become aware of our own feelings and automatic reactions, and slow down enough to be able to choose a more mindful and communicative way.
