Integrated Program exams – as per DOET requirements, students in Years 6-9 have completed their Semester 2 exams.

Year 8 Outward Bound Vietnam – the final trip of the year for SIS students to Quy Nhon takes place May 6-10, and will be for students in Year 8 classes.

Cambridge exams (IGCSE2, AS, A) – ongoing until 14 June, students in the affected classes have been informed of the specific dates for each subject exam.

Semester 2 Exams (Years 1-9) – from May 20-30 these will cover topics as stated in the Table of Specifications. Shortly following the conclusion of exams Grade Reports will be issued.

Yearbooks – these are scheduled to be distributed Monday 17 June, subject to change.

Year 4 to A/GAC – arrive at 16:00; concert begins at 16:30 (anticipated end time 18:30)

Sight words are crucial to early reading and writing as they are words that frequently appear in texts. In order to support students in their learning of sight words, we have created a variety of fun ways to teach them.

One such activity involves forming the words using tiles. In this activity, students are required to form the specified word using square tiles. This activity not only enforces the spelling of the word, but it also challenges students to devise ways in creating the "tricky" letters such as, 'a' and 's.' After much practice, they each have created their own ways in forming these letters!

Another fun activity that the students enjoy is, *Sight Words Snakes 'n' Ladders*. Like the classic board game, this version involves students throwing the die and moving their counters across the board. However, it also requires students to read out the sight words their counters had landed on. Other players are to check whether the reading is correct. If it is wrong, he or she would lose a turn.
