STEM Room

The brand new STEM room has now been finished and students now have regular timetabled classes in the STEM room



The new STEM room has brand new facilities and a new STEM curriculum for the whole school. All primary and secondary students will have at least one session of STEM on their timetable each week.

Students will be studying robotics and CREST award science using brand new facilities. These new facilities include MicroBlock robot kits and a 3D printer and the UBTech robot kits for secondary school students. We already have a large number of Arduino electronics kits which students will use to do electronic prototyping.

The new robot kits will be used to teach students about micro electronics, engineering and programming. Knowledge and understanding of these subjects is now in high demand though out the world and are important parts of the modern economy.

Last year's STEM days were very successful, but this is now a step up as this is now part of the timetable for all classes. We hope by the end of the year all the students on the campus will be experts in this kind of technology and ready to build a high tech future.

Dyned

Starting this semester, the EPP program has been replaced by DynEd. DynEd is an English language program which can be studied online. This will allow students to study outside the classroom at home on a computer or tablet device. The students' progress and level can also be very easily checked online.

The adoption of this programme is intended to offer students more opportunities to improve their English both in class and at home. DynEd has been used successfully to deliver English language teaching in many

countries and is an excellent way to prepare students for further and higher education.

In order to access the programme, students need to download the app onto a PC or tablet. The app works on Windows, IOS and Android (currently there is no OSX version for Apple computers). It is recommended that students use a large screen device for studying rather than a mobile phone.

Please make sure you select Vietnam from the download options as this connects to the Asia servers.

Once you have downloaded and installed the app the students can logon using the details provided by their DynEd tutor. They will then be able to continue to study at home and you will be able to monitor their progress.
