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New STEM Room facilities

Most of the fantastic new STEM room facilities have finally arrived. This includes 26 UBtech Advanced robot kits and 26 UBtech Explorer robot kits. Also, included is an Alpha 1 humanoid robot, a 42 inch touch screen TV/computer and 25 Ipads. These new facilities are already being used for the new timetabled STEM classes in the curriculum. This week students are using the new facilities to make robots and explore controlling them with visual scripting.



The STEM room represents a significant investment by the Board of Management for the KinderWorld Education Group aimed at making Singapore Schools a leader in STEM based teaching and learning. We aim to ensure that students become technologically literate and are not simply passive consumers of technology but also experts and innovators in technology.

This is only the beginning as there are still more purchases to arrive on the campus. For primary we will also have the MBlock robots arriving shortly.



Business Investment Competition - Wharton University Pennsylvania

As a class we have entered a competition created by Wharton University Pennsylvania, in order to give students, the opportunity to learn about the world of investing. Not only do you learn about investment, but you can also improve some of your other skills, e.g. communication, teamwork, and analytical skills. All of the lesson plans that the students need to be able to organize an investment, are on the Wharton Global Youth Programme website. These plans have instructions and plans for both teachers and students. The plans help us to understand what we need to do and where to we start.

DynEd Study skills

Students across the school are now using DynEd as part of their English studies. In order to get the most from this programme it is important for students to use the software correctly.

One of the most important features of the DynEd

programme is interactive listening and speaking. Students should ideally use a device with headphones and a microphone. The software uses a microphone

to check student pronunciation, so a decent pair of headphones with a microphone will help greatly. Make sure the audio parts are working well.

When studying DynEd students should use the Listen, repeat, record, playback buttons on the screen. These buttons will help students to perfect not only the grammar and vocabulary, but also the pronunciation.

Following these steps should help to ensure that students achieve high scores in the programme.

Tips on Effective Study on DynEd – Years 3 to iGCSE:

- Do DynEd activities for 25 to 40 minutes every day. Complete a variety of activities and spend no longer that 5 minutes per activity in each session
- Listening and then repeating the words and sentences whilst recording yourself and then play back, is very important and students can increase their scores
- Use the record, repeat and listening buttons as often as possible
- > After 2 days, repeat the same activities
- Student's progress can be monitored by parents when clicking the TUTOR button on DynEd. It is important that students are monitored at home as well for further motivation.

Silver medal prize IOE

Several SIS Vung Tau students have won the provincial prize and the silver medal at the national level of the IOE exam for the academic year 2019-2020. This is an English competition for Vietnamese schools throughout the country and province.
