Wharton Global High School Investment Competition: iGCSE Classes – SIS @ Vung Tau



As being the represented members of the Wharton Global High School Investment Competition's teams, we would like to describe our experience through the 3 months.

Each team that joined the business competition had \$100,000. Overall, every team member had to find suitable stocks in their sectors at first and then chose the quantity of the stocks that they wanted to buy, which corresponded to the amount of money each team member had after the division of the funds. Before the teams could start trading, they had to divide the money among each of the members depending on which sectors they chose. The profit or loss of each team was updated everyday so each team could see what stocks were the least profitable and then sell or reduce the quantities of those stocks. After 3 months, we had to write a mid-term report and also an end-of-term or final report, which we wrote about our stocks, including the benefits or how it affected the profits of the whole team.

Throughout the competition, we learnt how to use both qualitative and quantitative analysis to understand the value of the companies in which we chose to invest. This is an important skill to develop because whether we were finding out about the CEO or the income statement, we were researching about our options so that, as investors, we could make the best decisions about where to put our money. We also had to developed a disciplined decision-making process. We could not control the end result of our investments, but we could control and determine whether we were following a process that could lead to good decisions over time. So we made decisions based on both quantitative and qualitative analysis.

Although we had learnt some new skills, we still had to improve a lot. The competition was like a new challenge to some of the teams, including us, so we were not used to it at first but we adapted quickly. Collaboration could be an issue because everyone had their own ideas which could make members in the team argue with each other to prove their point of view so decisions were difficult to make. The understanding of making the right decision can take a lot of time so errors can occur.

In our opinion, the competition is an opportunity for us to learn how to be competitive in business with other teams, while enjoying the useful lessons that we have learnt throughout the experience.

(Our iGCSE students took part in this global Business Competition with the emphasis on investments and to understand the share market. This experience for the students were invaluable and they have learned such a lot of skills, terminologies and their research have helped them to be worthy participants. Well done to all of them!)
