Dorothy: Like, who would want green and grey pizza filled with poison? Eww, gross!


Lion: Yeah, that's disgusting!


Scarecrow: Hey everyone, you forgot about me!

With one small step on the Lunar surface 52 years ago, Neil Armstrong entered his country's pantheon of heroes and made one giant leap for mankind, calving a moment of greatness that defined the next scientific frontier.

Upon landing on the moon, Armstrong radioed back to Earth the historic statement: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." The one small step on the lunar surface turned out to be one giant inspiration for young learners in the world of science.

Working in groups online, the students formed the flight crew. Pumbaa, Ben, Sally, Henry and Mia were the Flight Directors. The Command Module pilots included Hugo, Leo and Jenny. The Lunar Module pilots were Polly, Jacky, Do An and Nick while the Flight Engineers were Kenneth, Max and Vu.


