Our students' future, their academic success and readiness for accept the challenges that the future may hold, starts here and we as a community will stand strong in supporting our students in achieving their goals


Congratulations to IGCSE ICT 2021

STEM Secondary Classes

The secondary STEM classes have continued online this term with Microsoft Makecode. Makecode is an online programming platform that allows students to program for a variety of outcomes. It offers virtual hardware platforms such as BBC Microbit and web based JavaScript programming with Arcade.





Students have been exploring various aspects of programming such as functions and arrays. Languages like JavaScript are fairly ubiquitous now a days. They are used extensively across many technologies. Students can learn about many of the key concepts involved in using these languages and become more confident in their ability to use programming tools to create interactive content.

In summary more than 50% of the results have been recorded A^* - meaning 90 to 100% achievements. The further breakdown is:

Total A results scored = 19

Total B results scored = 13

Total C results scored = 9

Total D results scored = 1
