

STEM Electronics



This term students have been learning about electronic components using a bread board and a BBC Microbit. The bread board is the name of the white board that the students plug the wires into. The board can be used to make electrical circuits. The Microbit can be attached to the breadboard and used to control inputs and outputs from the breadboard. They are using the Microbit to explore

microcontrollers and how we can use them to control small devices. Students certainly enjoyed the experiences tremendously.
