**OBV OVERNIGHT FOR OUR YEAR 4 AND YEAR 5 STUDENTS OCTOBER 20-23**

October 20th saw the arrival of Mr. Phuc and Ms. Nada straight from Outward Bound Vietnam (OBV) in Quy Nhon to our campus here in Vung Tau. They were here, as OBV staff, to lead our Year 4 and Year 5 classes over two days (with an overnight sleepover on campus) of fun and learning activities that would help our students become better leaders and improve upon their teamwork inside as well as outside of the classroom.

Each day was broken down into different activities and games where the students were led in team-building as well as leadership building exercises within their year level groups. The boys and girls would eat an early breakfast, have some morning exercises and stretches, then get into the undertakings for the day. They would have the same morning break and lunchtimes as the rest of the school. They would then continue with the fun and learning before it was time to clean up and get ready for the evening dinner. From there they would finish up the day before getting into bed for a good rest to be ready for the next day.

Out of the Year 5 students surveyed, eighty percent of them felt that they got the chance to show off their leadership skills during the two days with OBV. Sixty percent of the Year 4 students felt the same way. Ninety-one percent of the Year 4 students and seventy-nine percent of the Year 5 classes said that the OBV Overnight helped them to understand the importance of leading an active, healthy lifestyle.

Some of the helpful words of encouragement that the Year 4 and 5 classes left for next year's OBV participants were:

You are going to have fun! Don't cry, be brave and you will learn a lot. Don't be afraid of staying overnight away from your Mother and Father, you will be fine! Listen to the OBV instructors and you will learn many things. You will learn how you can succeed with Teamwork, rather than working on your own. There is nothing to be afraid of during the overnight. Don't pack too much, you are only staying for one night!

## Year 5L Science

As part of their studies for the recent Science unit on Cells, Year 5L made observations using microscopes. One of the challenges was just learning how to use a microscope properly: focusing carefully, adjusting proper lighting, preparing slides, discerning what is the true subject as opposed to dirt on the lens or air bubbles under the slide.

Year 5L were fascinated by the cheek and onion cells they observed and were amazed also by the prepared slides of various plants and insects.
