CELL PHONE POLICY

SIS@BDNC has a no cell phone policy for our students. We believe it is important for students to learn to communicate and play with each other during their break times. As such, children are allowed to bring cell phones to school and, in the case of high school, even use them as a learning tool but they are not permitted to play games, visit social media websites, call or send messages during school hours. Parents can support us by reminding children of the policy and by not calling your child before 4.30pm.

PICK UP OF CHILDREN AT 5PM

We wish to remind parents that children must be picked up by no later than 5pm. All school staff finish work at 5pm and children still at school have to be supervised by the security staff. They are not trained to supervise small children and nor is it part of their official job description. It is also not fair on children to have to wait so long to be picked up. KinderWorld policy also has a clause stating that parents who are late in picking up their children *pay a late fee.* We do not unnecessarily wish to implement this penalty, but may be forced to do so considering the number of students who regularly get picked up late every day. Please support us in picking up your children before 5pm.

Pre-school children are encouraged to go home immediately after their last class or their club. This prevents them from becoming over-tired and helps them to study throughout the week. Again, it is highly unfair to expect small children to need to wait patiently for any extended period of time before being picked up.

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
