#### **School Uniforms:**

I want to take this opportunity to give you all a big "Thank you!" for supporting the use of uniforms at school. During the last couple of weeks, I have seen almost all students wearing their uniforms to school, with kids coming up to me and exclaiming, "Mr Kim, look, I'm in my uniform!" Keep up the excellent work!

On a more serious not I want to raise awareness about **Hand-Foot-Mouth Disease.**Please be vigilant with your children for the Hand-Foot-Mouth Virus. The virus usually doesn't seriously threaten a child's health, but it can be a very unpleasant condition for little ones. If you suspect your child has any of the symptoms, please visit your doctor and keep your child at home.

Possible symptoms typically are:

- Blisters inside the cheeks, gums and on the sides of the tongue, as well as on the hands and feet.
- May or may not have a low-grade fever, be listless, feel off colour and not eat well for a day or two.
- May complain of sore mouth for a few days before the blisters appear

#### **K1 Integrated**

This month we focused on recognizing and corresponding numbers from 1 to 5 through hands-on activities. Our children loved to match numbers on the caterpillar and match the numbers with pom poms.













This month we were revising three letters; S, A, T, and their vocabularies. The children liked to play the game with Ms Serg. They showed their confidence in saying the word out loud.













Our children made a beautiful autumn tree related to the letter T vocabulary. After the activity, they all wanted to bring the tree home.

Celebrating the Moon Festival is always a big event in our school and class. Since this month's beginning, teachers have been talking with the students about this special event and explaining the meaning of the Moon Festival. We also taught them words related to the theme.

Besides, they have a chance to enjoy many activities such as: listened to the story about Moon Festival, "Sự tịch chu cuội cung trăng", and learnt the song "Rước đèn ông sao".







The students also made moon festival cakes with playdough and paper lanterns, decorated them with sparkling stars, coloured lion masks, and watched the lion dance. Inside the classroom, there were snacks and traditional rice dishes to enjoy. The children listened to stories and sang Midautumn songs while eagerly waiting for the lion dance. Everyone was overjoyed to see the performance accompanied by a pounding drumbeat. A big thank you to all the parents for taking part in this special event.

















It has been a busy few weeks of settling back in the learning environment after the school event. The students have been working hard to enhance their literacy skills, particularly in reading. After each lesson, the students go to the literacy corner to practice reading CVC words with short vowels and choose any from the books assigned for each particular week. In addition to weekly Phonics and sight word homework, the students are encouraged to read books from Raz Kids on a regular basis. This month we focused on the letters M, D, G, O, C, and K. In Numeracy, the students continue counting to 50 and backwards, measuring length and height using class objects, revising patterns, number words to 10 and basic colour words. In STEM, the students were involved in different activities such as building bridges, magic milk, floating and sinking experiments and friendship salad.

The students always look forward to learning new letters and sounds each week. Every time they make nice Letterland crafts. It's so lovely to see them happy with their work.
