STUDENT PROTECTION WEEK

This year, KinderWorld introduced "student protection week " – this is a school-wide event which also includes the Prep and K2 classes and takes place for two weeks a year.

In our student protection week, Prep classes spent a week learning about our feelings, security, and personal space.

During this week, we started talking about respect and how to show it. We understood that respecting

understood that respecting and showing respect is treating people the way we would like to be treated kindly and nicely.




After respect, we talked about the people that help us, either our family members or safer "strangers," such as teachers, nurses, or police officers.

We followed learning about trust; we understood that we trust the people that respect and look after us.

We continued learning about our personal space and how to speak out when we don't feel safe or comfortable.

We finished the student protection week, understanding that we have "yes" and "no" feelings and how to keep ourselves safe.

By helping the students to understand these concepts, we create a safer and more honest community.



PHONICS IN DUCKLING CLASS

Letterland is a key component of the phonics programme in KinderWorld. This programme enables students to quickly learn the sounds of letters and work to blend (put together sounds



to make words e.g. c - a - t = cat) and segment (split words into individual sounds e.g. dog = d - o - g.



Students always like to explore the Letterland characters and learn their individual stories and the sounds that they make.

Since the beginning of the school year, the use of Letterland has enabled the students not only to learn phonics but also to develop their vocabulary.

Letterland is often taught through various games such as guessing, matching and hunting games.

In addition to learning about the sounds, students also learn about handwriting through



Letterland – learning songs to form letters and listening to stories which explain why some letters look different when they are uppercase.



In addition to learning about Letterland in our regular classes, our EFL teacher also reinfornces our phonics programme, making this system a very effective one indeed.

K1 CELEBRATING THE BEGINNING OF TET

The children in K1 classes have started looking forward to the upcoming Tet / Lunar New Year festivities. This is a very important time of the



year in Vietnam and thus Tet was our focus area for the two weeks between the holidays.



The highlight of our Tet celebrations was visiting Pegasus International College to make a traditional Tet cake - Banh Chung. They enjoyed dressing up in the chef outfits and listened carefully to the step-by-step instructions.

In addition, the children also enjoyed a whole range of

activities in school. Tet is symbolised by the beautiful peach blossom trees we see around the city, and the children decorated their very own trees in the classroom.

We made lots of other art and craft activities to celebrate and the children are now super excited and readv to celebrate Tet in their homes.



BABY BOOGIE / STAY AND PLAY

Parents/guardians have a very important part to play

in the development of their child's education. As a result, we always work to share our educational goals and techniques so



that we can work in collaboration.

We held our first "stay and play "with an excellent turnout. The purpose of these sessions was to allow parents/guardians to experience learning through play in practical terms, whilst learning the underlying reasoning behind the activities.



We plan to these have "stay and play" sessions on a regular basis look and forward to seeing you all at the next event.

Music and movement are a very important part of our curriculum – enabling students to learn English in a fun way, as well as learning about rhythm and rhyme. We are now extending this experience to those who are not yet old enough to attend school and welcome babies from 6 months and toddlers up to 2 years.

Our first session was thoroughly enjoyed by all look and we forward to welcoming even more very young learners for our "baby next boogie" session which is open to current parents and the general public.



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
