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HIGH SCHOOL REPORT

The Parent Teacher Conferences took place in early February, and it was encouraging as teachers to see the level of support from a number of parents. As the student's education - and their progress at school - is dependent on the cooperation between teachers, students and parents, your attendance at these opportunities is always highly appreciated.

On 24 February we held the school finals of the Spelling Bee competition. Competitors were very nervous and were encouraged by their classmates. To be put under so much pressure is not easy and we congratulate ALL the finalists who took part. Two overall winners were chosen from the High School. They are Aditya Kumar (IGCSE 2) and Vuong My Ky (Y9A). They now have to master a list of 3000 difficult words while preparing for the online competition between the SIS schools in the North and those from the South. This takes place on 24 March.
