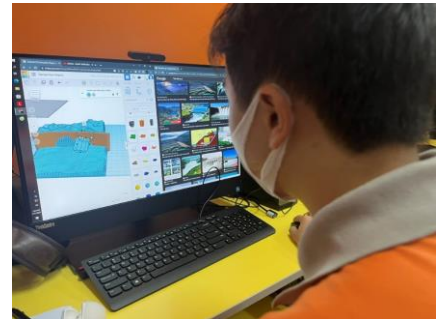
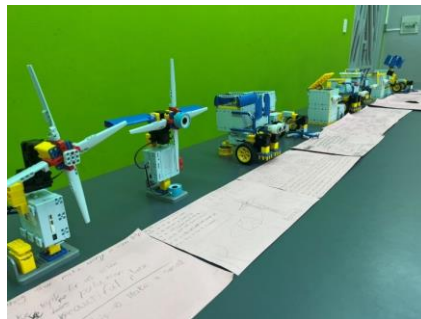

STEM REPORT

April's STEM was jam-packed with enjoyable, engaging, and difficult projects and activities. Students were given the opportunity to create robots that could tackle some of the environmental concerns that our planet was currently facing, such as a robot that could separate rubbish and clean the streets without the assistance of humans.
