School Policies / Updates

We would like to extend a gentle reminder of the school's parking policy, which is intended to improve student safety.

Short-term Parking

- All paved areas within the school are intended for <u>student drop-off and</u> <u>pick-up only</u>.
- Parking on school campus is <u>limited to</u> <u>5 minutes</u>.
- During drop-off and pick-up times (8:00-8:30a.m and 3:30-4:30p.m), parents wishing to park for longer than 5 minutes <u>must park outside school grounds</u>.

The main purpose of this policy is to ensure that students can be dropped off and picked up safely. In addition, your cooperation with this policy will help minimize traffic problems during these peak hours.
