Many thanks to those of you who took time to respond to the annual survey. Sharing your experiences and suggestions is a most important part of the ongoing school improvement process. One of our primary goals is to increase family engagement and the survey is one instrument which will help us to do to more effectively. After the results have been analyzed we will share the key findings, as well as planned steps to address any areas for improvement.

Recently we have been focusing on the School-Wide Learner Goal of "Active and Responsible Citizenship". This has been accomplished in several ways. For example, students in Years 1-5 participated in the Star Donation Challenge from RAZ-Kids. This involved them reading books and completing activities. They were then able to donate their stars towards healthy meals, clean drinking water or schools supplies for less fortunate children. Through events such as this we hope students come to understand and embrace the importance of helping others.

Our Outward Bound Vietnam excursions have also begun. During these students learn and practice a variety of skills, whether as part of the on-campus program for Years 4 and 5, the program at Quy Nhon for students in Years 6, 8, and IGCSE2, or that of Halong for students in Years 7, 9/IGCSE1 and AS & A Levels.
